
# DECEMBER 2023

# Our Journey Together

It is Advent! But the church calendar, the selected lectionary texts for this next several weeks, everything about Advent calls us to something different.



During this season we are called to a hopeful expectation – of preparing, of waiting, of watching, for the In-

carnation of Christ, which Pastor Adam Hamilton calls "one of the foundational, and some might say scandalous, claims of the Christian faith: namely, that the God who created all that is, who sustains the universe by his power, came to us in Jesus. He did not simply inspire Jesus, or speak through Jesus as he might inspire or speak through people today. No, Incarnation claims that God actually became flesh in Jesus."

We remember when this happened over 2,000 years ago, and we look forward, with hopeful expectation that Jesus will come to us once more.

If we are to live differently from the hustle-bustle world we are apart of, if we are to live as disciples of Jesus and not of society, then we need a fresh start. Bishop Will Willimon in our study book for Advent says that it is not within our power to make a fresh start, it must come as a gift from God. He says, "What we need is a God who refuses to be trapped in eternity, a God who not only cares about us but is willing to show up among us and do something with us, here, now."

This Advent, we are celebrating and anticipating the arrival of just such a God!



others' faces? Did I offer words of healing?" Nouwen continued, and we can too: "Did I let go of my anger and resentment? Did I forgive? Did I love?"
