
I hope that you, too, can find a way this Lent and beyond to invite God into your daily life and routine.

Leadership Team Meeting February 15, 2023

Members present: Pastor Teresa Whetsel, Cindy Deuter, Andrea Fiala, Joe Fiala, Chris Keeter, Eugene Moncur, Karen Steptoe, and JoAnn Testerman. Merle Jenner present as a visitor. Absent were Sara Gates, Dwight Greenough, Mike Moncur, Kayla Wagner. A new trustee member still needs to be chosen.

Loving

- Opening Devotional Cindy Deuter read today's devotional from The Upper Room which was based on Matthew 6:25-34.
- Mission Statement of UMC: To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Everything we do as a church should contribute to this mission
- 2-word check in- Pastor Teresa handed out some definitions to help us determine where the Team stands on the issues dividing the denomination. There was discussion of the terms and then a straw poll was taken. This showed us that 2/3 of the members present could be in a denomination in which not every congregation agreed on the issues surrounding human sexuality, and 1/3 could not.
- Prayer- Pastor Teresa lead the group in prayer

Learning

- UMC/GMC Discussion: Following the straw poll taken more discussion was had of educating our congregation on what information has been given out to the Leadership Team already and what more may need to happen. It was decided that a brief overview of the current status of denomination issues would be presented to the congregation on 2 consecutive Sundays immediately following church. These would be announced several weeks in advance at church, in bulletins, on multimedia, emails, on our Facebook page and website. Dates were set for March 12 & 19 to be followed by a Town Hall type meeting on the 22nd where presenters would be here to discuss both the UMC and the GMC. Between the informational overviews and the Town Hall, the congregation will have the opportunity to submit questions that the presenters will be asked.
- Election of Vice Chair- Andrea Fiala nominated Joe Fiala with Gene Moncur seconding the nomination. Nominations ceased. All voted in favor
- Officers for 2023 will be Cindy Deuter, Leadership Chairperson/ Finance Chairperson, Joe Fiala, Vice Chairman, Mike Moncur, Treasurer, JoAnn Testerman, Office Manager, and Pastor, Teresa Whetsel. JoAnn stated a new bank signature card will need to be signed with the new officers. She will get a copy of the minutes to Quoin Bank so these papers can be prepared.
- Input from those who worship on-line
 - ⇒ Can't hear singing during worship-can we have mics that pick up the congregation during songs? How much would it cost to upgrade the sound system?
 ⇒Automatic doors- the questioning person was told with the age of the building it was cost prohibitive at this point. Usher will help with doors and ring the church bell on Sundays.

Come Be Energized

After some time away from the church, author Donald E. Miller returned to the fold. He writes: "One thing that brought me back ... was asking simply: What are the alterna-

tives to the church? Where are the communities that sanction the pursuit of meaning and truth as a legitimate enterprise? that have material and personal resources to assist in this search? that provide regular occasions for confession of failures? that renew and inspire? that provide a setting where children are nurtured? where family members can be buried? where births can be celebrated? where social issues can be debated?"

Miller concludes: "There are a number of institutions that deal with one or several of these questions, but historically the church has demonstrated its ability to energize all of these activities."
