Treasurer's report for March- The report prepared by Mike Moncur showed revenues at \$9,689.33 and expenses at \$13,449.86 for a general fund difference of (\$3,780.53). YTD general fund difference of (\$8,391.80) At this point Mike highlighted things like what it costs each month to run the church and what income comes in regularly. Joe asked that the group do some brainstorming of how to increase revenue. Thoughts were to keep reminding people of automatic

deposits, stewardship thoughts, membership drive, block party and opportunities for moms and children. Joe asked that this remain on the agenda for more discussion and actions.

- c. Pastor's Report- Pastor Teresa said she will be out of the office April 30(after church), May 1 and 2 for a Clergy Women's Retreat. She will also be gone May 15-18 in Minnesota for a Preaching Festival.
- d. UMC/GMC discussion Before the discussion began, Pastor excused herself from the conversation. She wanted those present to be able to hold a frank discussion that might be hindered if she were present. She asked if she could lead the group in prayer and then dismissed herself to the sanctuary for further prayer.

Joe then opened the discussion concerning the UMC/GMA matters. Some comments started that Chairman Joe felt were more appropriate for Pastor- Parish Relations and not centered to the UMC/GMC matters. There was a lot of discussion about comments received after the congregational letter went out as to the feelings of folks that replied. There were not a lot of people that replied but the general consensus is that they want to know more of what is going on with the Methodist church.

Pastor Teresa returned to the meeting. After further discussion a motion was made by Linda Blackburn to continue to education the congregation on the issues facing the UMC. Seconded by Chris Keeter. Motion carried. Further discussion led to the decision that a sub-committee of Pastor, Joe F, and Chris K would meet to determine how to educate the committee and present their plan via email to the entire team.

There was no more business brought before the group.
